Flooding Issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sheriff Marston reported that the flood signs are still on back order. He also noted that bridges are being watched. (Grubb & Rice crested at 18.5 feet, Avenue T & Penn at Holyrood crosses North & South, First Road has experienced flash floods West & East at Avenues R & N, and Smoky river to crest @22.8 feet.) • Pallets of bags to be pre-deployed. • Wildlife & Parks has pre-deployed a flat boat • Army Core of Engineers has readied another boat. • Bags have been readied for Wilson and Kanopolis areas. • Roy will save feed bags for the Fire Dept. to use for sand bagging. • Noted that Kanopolis Lake is up 16 feet. Rock has been readied to make a road to the houses if impacted. • Discussion on mandatory evacuation. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Mayors will have authority to issue the evacuation not the fire department or Emergency Management - 7 inches of rain per hour in Wilson is a problem—North and East of Wilson is a flood area as well as G Street and 22nd Street. - Base elevation is level with water tower at Kanopolis 	Continue monitoring and responding as appropriate. 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HMR Presentation	<p>The HMR Company presented their capabilities for HazMat Response. Points of interest:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They are the number one HazMat response center in Kansas with a call center available 24/7 365 days a year. Noted that the State of Kansas is readdressing the quantities of chemicals to be cleaned-up and by whom. • A contracted customer status is available with a call to ONE CALL. Noted that because of our proximity to Great Bend, personnel from Great Bend will respond to issues in Ellsworth County. • HMR has the heavy equipment needed to deal with a variety of issues / chemicals. They primarily respond to pipeline customers and railroad customers. • They offer free consultation on identifying chemicals. They can provide hazmat response for acids, bases, corrosives, fuels, truck wrecks, etc. HMR does not handle asbestos, provides limited support for radiation and explosives.
